Attached is the list of the models announced by CMC for 2022. In short:

- 3 new colors for the Ferrari GTB/C
- 5 versions of the Mercedes Uhlenhaut Coupe (1 re-issue)

The FERRARI 275 GTB/C models could already be pre-ordered from 2020 (the Le Mans version M-199 even from 2019), which is why these models are now all sold out (ie pre-ordered) at CMC. CMC has significantly increased the prices for these models. Due to the corona crisis (and the forced relocation of the CMC factory in China), considerable backlogs have now arisen in the delivery schedule. Higher costs of labour, materials and transportation have led CMC forced to raise prices. If you have pre-ordered a model you will pay the new price for this model (in accordance with my general terms and conditions). However, you may also cancel the order free of charge. There is still a discount of 5% on the prices that CMC uses itself for the Ferrari-models pre-ordered. The list shows the new prices, including the discount of 5%. I would like to receive a message from you no later than Sunday 6 February whether you want to maintain or cancel your order. For the Ferrari GTB/C models I can at least take orders for model M-210, the red street version. From the other models (M-199, M-211, M-212 and M-213, a few models are still available, and availability also depends on whether any orders are canceled due to the price increases. The 3 new versions (M-238 green, 239 blue and 240 yellow) can be pre-ordered until 11 February with a 10% discount (see the price on the list).

The Alfa Romeo P3 models were pre-orderable from 2021. There is also a price increase for these models. Giving you the right to cancel your pre-order free of charge. For existing orders and for new orders, a 10% discount applies until Friday 11 February. The prices on the list include this discount.

The third model (Mercedes Uhlenhaut) is new. You can pre-order these up to and including Friday 11 February with an extra 10% discount (see the list).

Contrary to previous reports, CMC has not yet introduced models of the Porsche 904.

For pre-orders, I do not ask for a deposit, but I do count on the fact that you will purchase the model in due course (except for a price increase by CMC before the model comes on the market, or a calamity).

I repeat what I already said in my pre-announcement a few days ago about the great importance of pre-ordering:

- of the 10 new models released by CMC in 2021, 9 are now sold out already
- You can see that all versions of the Ferrari GTB/C announced so far are almost completely preordered/sold out.

Furthermore, by pre-ordering you are (almost) sure that you will receive the model at the lowest possible price. The prices for sold-out models at CMC often go up sharply. For instance: Google the price of the Ferrari car transporter M-084 or the (red) Ferrari GTO (M-154), issued only 6 years ago. I can imagine that with the considerably increased prices you wonder whether you want to cancel your order. In that case, before you do that, I ask you to take a look at the attachment to this Newsletter: "On the other hand..."

Please cancel no later than 6 February, so that I have time for a possible redistribution.

Have fun with your "preview" of the new models.
